2024 FACT SHEET

Since 1828, the Medical College of Georgia, the state's flagship medical school and Augusta University's founding school, has been producing GREAT DOCTORS AND GREAT MEDICINE. With the nation's 8th largest class size — currently at 264 students per class — MCG is the state's leading provider of physicians. Nearly 50% of our graduates remain in Georgia to practice.

In July 2024, MCG's class size will grow to 304, putting it on track to be the 4th or 5th largest. The educational experience has been anchored in Augusta for nearly 200 years and will soon include a new four-year campus — in Savannah in partnership with Georgia Southern University — in addition to the four-year Augusta University/University of Georgia Medical Partnership Campus in Athens that opened in 2010. MCG also has three regional clinical campuses, for third- and fourth-year students, in Albany, Savannah/Brunswick and Rome/Dalton, and plans to establish its fourth in Atlanta at Wellstar Kennestone Hospital in 2025.



Essential programmatic support is provided by the Georgia Research Alliance, an internationally acclaimed model for bringing business, research universities and state government together to create and sustain a vibrant, technology-driven economy.

Wellstar MCG Health, the state's only public academic medical

center, is working to revolutionize health care and enhance the well-being of communities across Georgia. The partnership is helping to expand medical training, research and clinical care throughout the state, while implementing a successful model of bringing together community-based health systems and academic medical centers. Wellstar will invest nearly \$800 million over 10 years in facilities and infrastructure, including more than \$200 million allocated to Wellstar MCG Health Medical Center, as well as capital for a new hospital, medical office building and ambulatory surgery center in neighboring Columbia County and the costs associated with implementing a new state-funded electronic medical records system.
