

## Choose the Track that's right for you...

### Traditional Curriculum Clerkship



- Scholarship for all students
- Block rotations with NBME ("shelf") exam after each block
- Rotation lottery preference over Augusta based students
- One-on-one clinical experiences, career mentoring, exam prep and support
- Access to the SW Leadership Scholar Program
- Most weekends open for research projects and study time

### Longitudinal Integrated Curriculum (LIC) Clerkship



- Scholarship for all students
- 3 week core rotations, twice (for spaced repetition and minimized burnout)
- More dedicated study time
- 6 week integrated Neurology/ Psychiatry block
- Weekly Family Medicine rotation (continuity clinic)
- SW Leadership Scholar Program built into curriculum
- Small group academic half days
- Most weekends open for research projects and study time
- Residency options in IM, Psych or FM for Peach State Scholars and no commitment 3 year med school

## Leadership and Advocacy


- Students on SW campus (Traditional and LIC) are part of this enriching curriculum for leadership and advocacy
