

Type III Frontal Cells and Frontal Sinus Surgery Stil Kountakis, MD, PHD, FACS

Endoscopic sinus surgery is safe with low risk for complications in the hands of trained surgeons. Many publications have focused on the complexity of the frontal recess and specifically, Bent JP et al (1) described the 4 different types of frontal cells that are found in 25% of the patients and add to the complexity of the frontal recess.
