The use of music and musical activities in the treatment of patients is designed in an attempt to help them overcome mental, emotional and physical difficulties. Music alone cannot be an effective treatment, but it has been seen this summer how the music therapist can contribute to the total treatment program and she herself become a cooperative and respected member of the therapy team.

Miss Stevens used many and varied types of musical activities — all of which were thoroughly enjoyed by the patients. Group Singing was a favorite. It created feelings of socialization and acceptance among members of the group. The rhythm band proved the most successful. Besides being very simple to play, the band instruments were all made by the patients themselves. The action songs, autoharp lessons and pantomines offered a chance for physical stimulation, body coordination, socialization and freedom to project themselves.
