
### **NEW COURSE**

Dr. Mabes launched the new **Rural Interactive Trauma Surgery course (The RITS)** in partnership with the Georgia Trauma Commission, on August 29 at Wellstar Douglas Medical Center in Douglasville, GA, with an outstanding turnout.

Over 30 providers attended, with 20 officially registered participants, representing a broad range of disciplines across the trauma team. This milestone was made possible through the support of our newly established Surgical Education and Simulation Research Fellowship, with inaugural fellow Dr. Zack Aldaher joining Dr. Erika Simmerman Mabes, Director of Surgical Simulation and Research Fellowship Program Director, in facilitating the course.

In collaboration with the Medical College of Georgia, we were proud to offer Continuing Medical Education (CME) credit for all participants. The training was extremely well received, and knowledge assessments and participant feedback are now under review. This course marks the beginning of an exciting new partnership between the Georgia Trauma Commission, the Medical College of Georgia, and community hospitals statewide, as we work to expand trauma education and training throughout rural Georgia.
