

#### INFECTION PREVENTION

Please be mindful that we are getting deeper into the respiratory illness season, we are seeing more COVID-19 and COVID-19 combined with other respiratory illnesses in our community. Our goal is to protect our residents, families, staff, and community. We are committed to following the guidance of the CDC to meet this goal. The guidelines describe implementation steps to help limit the spread of infection when a staff member or resident develops any respiratory illness in our facility. Its guidance also offers the necessary steps to protect our families and other visitors from getting sick. Please note the following:

- 1. Practice social distancing when appropriate.
- 2. Please wash/sanitize your hands frequently.
- 3. Wipe down surfaces frequently with disinfectants.
- 4. Masks are available for <u>all staff and visitors</u>. Please check-in when visiting to find out the current mask requirement.

Although we are already seeing quite a bit of COVID-19 in the community, this is flu season and, in the state of Georgia, we are seeing a lot more COVID-19 combined with other respiratory illnesses such as the flu. Once an individual has been infected with any of these respiratory viruses, viral shedding begins within 24 to 48 hours, and it usually takes about 24 hours before symptoms begin. These can include fever or feeling feverish; a stuffy or runny nose; cough; muscle and body aches; headache; fatigue; and vomiting and diarrhea, which are more typical in children than in adults. We have already administered the influenza vaccine to those residents that wanted it, however, if you previously declined it is not too late to do so.

Respiratory virus symptoms can range from asymptomatic to severe illness. Symptoms usually manifest, usually between 2 and 14 days but typically by day 5. People infected with RSV are usually contagious for 3 to 8 days and may become contagious a day or two before they start showing signs of illness.

Please help us keep your loved ones and staff safe. If you are sick, please do not visit the facility. If you are interested in a facetime call, please contact the social worker or floor manager. Thank you!





#### THE CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

WITH CHAPLAIN TIMOTHY LARK

#### The Heart

But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The LORD does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart." 1Samuel 16:7 NIV

I'm so happy that you have joined us once again! We have swiftly moved through this previous month and entered the chilly, crisp month of November. I've been enjoying the changing colors of the trees and cooler temperatures. Let's prepare for a unique winter.

I would like you to return to the top of this page and carefully meditate upon the passage of scripture before proceeding to read this article. Samuel, the prophet, was reminded that the holy Lord sees beyond what other people may see. God is examining our hearts. In this text, the heart is not the actual organ that sits in the center of your chest, just to the left behind the breastbone (sternum). No, he is not referring to that which is shielded by your rib cage, nestled between the lungs, with the left lung slightly smaller to accommodate its position, but your spiritual heart, referring to the mind, will, emotions, intellect, inner moral, and spiritual life. Perhaps we ought to ask ourselves, what does God see in our hearts?

I've come to realize that my heart is the source of every decision and choice I make. The state of my heart determines the course of my life! 


