- Scotland has 5 ski resorts











Scotland's National Health Service (NHS)



Health services in Scotland are the responsibility of the Scottish Government

The majority of NHS Scotland provision is funded through taxation, healthcare is free at the point of delivery.

Access to NHS services is based on clinical need, not an individual's ability to pay.

14 individual health boards in Scotland

- Scottish Ambulance Service
- NHS Education Scotland (NES)





Public Health Scotland - Priorities



- Scotland's health is poor compared to other Western European Nations
- Life expectancy varies significantly in Scotland
- Scotland has the worst health inequalities in Western Europe
- In order to address this the Scottish Government has set 6 PH Priorities

Nurse Education in Scotland

NHS Education for Scotland (NES)

- Aim for skilled and sustainable workforce
- Undergraduate nurse education is free in Scotland
- NES fund all Undergraduate nursing and some Post Graduate courses.


Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) – Governing Body for nursing in UK

NMC set standards of education, training, conduct and performance for nurses and midwives in the UK

NMC register nurses, midwives and nursing associates when they have successfully completed their courses.



NES Continuing Professional Development and Post Registration Framework



Career Framework level	Minimum associated SCQF level
5 Practitioner	Level 9 – Ordinary Degree level
6 Senior Practitioner	Level 10 – Honours Degree level
7 Advanced Practitioner	Level 11 – Master's Degree level
8 Consultant Practitioner	Level 11/12 – Master's/Doctorate level
